SaferNet is a program that speaks to safety on the internet; explore new technology familiar to teens and ways to promote positive choices while on-line. This is a presentation based program that proves to be informative and enlightening for anyone who has entered the world of technology. Safe Futures has developed unique SaferNet presentations for a variety of audiences.

SaferNet for students

Assembly style: One hour presentation in the library or gymnasium for one grade or 'division' at a time whenever possible.

Classroom presentation: One hour presentation to students in their classroom which allows for more questions and further exploration of strategies.

Additional presentation options: A full day of presentations, one grade at a time, based on the school schedule. The best possible location for this type of day is in the library or gymnasium with students coming to the presentation at their scheduled time and sit on chairs.

SaferNet for parents

A two hour presentation to explore the issues of internet safety, ways to stay safe and positive choices while on-line. You will discover the wide world of teen technology and learn safety strategies for your home. You will leave the workshop with information about the most current and up to date internet issues that youth face today.

SaferNet for school staff

Lunch and Learn: Brief presentation about the concept during a scheduled lunch at your school. This option also lends itself to a one hour session immediately following the school day.

Teachers, custodians, CYW's and office staff are all encouraged to participate in the session. You will learn to implement strategies and discuss their implementation as a team.

P.A Day or PLC time: We will deliver a presentation created specifically designed to fit the needs of the school staff and the climate of the school environment.
